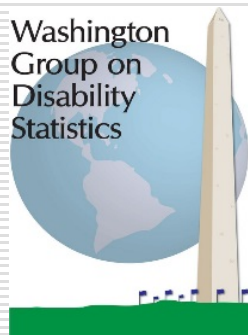

A unique opportunity in time

- UNCRPD, SDGs, 2020 Censuses, DHS, MICs
- Disability data collection – a global momentum
- The collection of high-quality statistics, which are comparable across countries
- Improving the ability to describe the situation of persons with disability
