



Other Disability Data Collections

- Eight countries reported that they will carry out stand-alone disability surveys (Argentina, Australia, Canada, the Gambia, Kenya, Qatar, Peru and Samoa)
- The vast majority of countries that completed a country report form (n=47/59) collect disability data in administrative records, most often in disability registries, or in relation to social protection allowances, education or health services
- A few countries (n=9/59) reported awareness of COVID-19 related disability data collection
