The Washington Group on Disability Statistics (WG) is a UN city group established under the United Nations Statistical Commission. The WG was constituted to address the urgent need for cross-nationally comparable population based measures of disability. Its mandate is the promotion and co-ordination of international co-operation in the area of health statistics focusing on disability data collection tools suitable for censuses and national surveys.

The WG has sought to foster international collaboration, and in particular, to insure that its efforts are broad-based and inclusive of voices from developing countries from every region of the world. Representatives of National Statistical Offices around the world, as well as Disabled People's Organizations (DPO), and other international organizations are encouraged to participate in the WG.

With funding from the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade the Washington Group on Disability Statistics (WG) is launching this new website, with the support of the Leonard Cheshire Disability and Inclusive Development Centre at University College London.

Disability Data Disaggregation: Joint Statement by the Disability Sector

"...to ensure international comparability and comparability over time for the purposes of SDG data disaggregation for adults, we recommend the use of the Washington Group short set of questions. For disaggregation by disability among children the recommended tool is the UNICEF/ Washington Group module on Child Functioning. Both instruments can be easily and cost effectively inserted in all national data collection efforts."

Excerpt from statement by the New Zealand representative on behalf of: Argentina, Australia, Austria, Brazil, Bulgaria, Canada, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Finland, Iceland, Jamaica, Jordan, Norway, Panama, Poland, Spain, Tunisia, Turkey, United Kingdom, United States, and New Zealand.

- We strongly recommend the Washington Group questions to be used as a tool to disaggregate data by disability, particularly in household surveys and national agendas.
- We urge the United Nations Statistical Division to utilize the Washington Group's short set of questions and recommend this tool to national statistical officers and the IAEG-SDG.
- Delays in doing so could have detrimental consequences to the implementation processes of the SDGs which will leave persons with disabilities uncounted and behind.
